**PAGE NO. 161 – CONSTITUTION OF NATIONAL COMPANY LAW APPELLATE  
TRIBUNAL [SECTION 410]**

**Entire Topic shall be substituted by the following Topic:**

**Constitution of National Company Law Appellate Tribunal [Section 410]**

The Central Government shall, by notification, constitute, with effect from such date as may be specified therein, an Appellate Tribunal to be known as the National Company Law Appellate Tribunal consisting of a **Chairperson** and such number of Judicial and Technical Members, as the Central Government may deem fit, to be appointed by it by notification, for hearing appeals against the orders of the *National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT)* or *National Financial Reporting Authority (NFRA)* or *Competition Commission of India (CCI)*.

*It may be noted that the Ministry of Corporate Affairs has issued notification for constitution of the National Company Law Appellate Tribunal (NCLAT) with effect from 1<sup>st</sup> June, 2016.*

**PAGE NO. 167 – CONSTITUTION OF SPECIAL COURTS [SECTION 435]**

**First Para shall be substituted by the Following Para:**

As per Section 435 of the Companies Act, the Central Government may, for the purpose of providing speedy trial of offences under this Act, *except under Section 452*, by notification, establish or designate as many Special Courts as may be necessary.
